President Biden signed into law the \$1.9 trillion American Rescue Plan on March 11, 2021.

State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (FRF)

\$350 billion

of non-competitive funding for states, counties, cities, Tribes and territories.
Of this funding:

\$195.3 billion

to states and Washington, D.C.

\$130.2 billion

to local governments

\$20 billion

to Tribal governments

Other provisions of the bill include:
